

## First Aid & Emergency Preparedness Campout October 16-18

**Where:**

This campout will be held at the Greene Valley Forest Preserve sites 2 and 3. We'll be camping in tents Friday and Saturday nights and the Scouts will be cooking by patrol.

**When:**

Arrive at St. Raphael's at 6:00 pm for a prompt 6:30 pm departure on Friday, October 16<sup>th</sup>.

**DO NOT DRIVE DIRECTLY TO THE CAMPSITE – YOU MUST CHECK IN AT THE CHURCH**

Return: Sunday, October 18th. Plan on meeting your son at St. Raphael's around 11am unless you make other arrangements with the person driving your son. Most times drivers take scouts directly home; check with your son's driver.

**Costs:**

There is a \$10 fee per Scout payable to BSA Troop 510, which should be turned in with the permission slip. Adults attending this campout will not be charged a fee.

Due to the closeness of the campground, there will be no reimbursement for driving.

**General Information:**

If you as a parent wish to attend and/or drive, you must have completed the BSA background (reference) check, the BSA Youth Protection Training & the Catholic Church's Protecting God's Children. This is a tenting campout and the weather is unpredictable, so dress and gear up accordingly. **Rain gear is always required.** Per insurance specifications and to promote Scout unity, the khaki uniform (Class A) shirt must be worn to and from all Troop 510 activities.

**Electronics:** No electronics will be allowed on this campout. This includes, but is not limited to, cell phones, game consoles and PDAs. Any such devices are subject to confiscation.

**Prescription Drugs:** Without exception, no prescription drugs may be in the possession of any Scout during the campout. Any and all prescription drugs must be turned in to the adult leader coordinating the outing. Guidelines for administering such drugs to Scouts must be provided to the coordinator.

**The Scouts will need to grub for all meals: Saturday Breakfast, Lunch & Dinner / Sunday Breakfast. As a guideline, \$10.00 per Scout should be sufficient.**

**\*\*In addition to this permission slip, a BSA Activity Consent Form must also be filled out for each Scout and signed by a parent or guardian. \*\***
